LOCAL LAW NO. 1 OF 1932.

ENTITLED AN ACT to amend Section 150, Par. (3) of the City Charter of the City of Plattsburgh, N.Y., being part of Chapter 269 of the Laws of 1902 of the State of New York, providing for the collection of taxes under two separate warrants.

BE IT ENACTED by the Mayor and Common Council of the City of Plattsburgh, N.Y., that Section 150, Paragraph (3) of the City Charter be superseded by the following:

SECTION 150: Levy of taxes by the Common Council-tax rolls: Paragraph 3. The amount necessary to defray the expenses for the next fiscal year as authorized and provided in this Act, such general city taxes shall be divided into two equal parts and two separate warrants shall issue therefor. The first warrant to be issued shall include delinquent water charges and special assessments of the previous year not heretofore paid, with attending fees and in addition, one-half of the general city tax, and such other items as the Common Council deem best to include. The second warrant to be issued at such time as in the judgment of the Common Council it will be most convenient and least burdensome to taxpayers, but not later than August first in any one year, shall include all taxes not included in the first warrant. Nothing herein contained, however, shall prevent the payment by any taxpayer of the total amount of his or her annual tax after the issuance of the first warrant.

This Local Law shall take effect immediately upon approval.
On roll call Aldermen Holland, Roach, Raymond, Light,
Spearman and Shay voted in the affirmative. No one in the negative.
CARRIED.

The foregoing Local Law, after Public Hearing, is hereby approved this 26th day of February, 1932.
