By Alderman Holland; seconded by Alderman LeClair: LOCAL LAW NO. 3 OF 1949.

ENTITLED AN ACT providing for the establishment and organization of a Department of Water and Sewage in the City of Plattsburgh, New York.

BE IT ENACTED by the Mayor and Common Council of the City of Plattsburgh, New York:

Section 1. Organization. As of February 1st, 1949, there shall be in the City of Plattsburgh a department of Water and Sewage. department shall have exclusive jurisdiction over all sources of water supply within and without the City of Plattsburgh; over all water mains, pipes and lines within and without said City of Plattsburgh and over all sewer lines within said eity, together with the Filtration Plant, Sewage Disposal Plant, pumping stations and over other plants within said City, and shall have exclusive jurisdiction over all facilities for water and sewage which may be acquired in the future. This department shall be headed by a Superintendent who shall be responsible to and under the direction of the Mayor and Common Council of the City of Plattsburgh. Said superintendent shall be paid an annual salary of \$4100.00 per year.

Said Superintendent shall be provided an office in the Sewage Disposal Plant located within said city.

Section 2. Personnel. All the personnel now employed by the Department of Public Works of the City of Plattsburgh in the Filtration Plant and the Sewage Disposal Plant are hereby transferred to the Department of Water and Sewage at the salaries they are now receiving and without any change in Civil Service status. The Common Council may upon the application of the Superintendent of Water and Sewage transfer such other employees as may be necessary from the Department of Public Works to the Department of Water and Sewage without any change in pay or status.

Section 3. Transfer of Property. The Common Council shall on or before February 1st, 1949 direct the transfer from the Department of Public Works to the Department of Water and Sewage all such equipment as the Council may in its judgment deem necessary for the operation of said Department of Water and Sewage.

Section 4. Laws Repealed. All laws inconsistent with this law are hereby superseded.

Section 5. Time of Taking Effect. This law shall take effect as of February 1st, 1949, after public hearing and approval by the Mayor.

On roll call, Aldermen Holland, LeClair, Villoni, Croteau, Ryan and Cardi voted in the affirmative; no one in the negative, CARRIED.
