LOCAL LAW NO. 5 OF 1941.

ENTITLED AN ACT to Amend Section 2 of Local Law No. 3 of 1939, providing for the appointment of investigators, municipal clerks, account clerks and stenographer for the Department of Public Welfare and fixing the duties and salaries therefor — in this instance providing for an increase in the salary of the stenographer, one investigator, account clerk and one municipal clerk.

BE IT ENACTED by the Mayor and Common Council of the City of Plattsburgh, New York, that Section 2 of Local Law No. 3 of 1939, be and the same is hereby amended, and as so amended to be superseded by the following:

SECTION 2. Salaries and Compensation. The annual salary of each of three investigators shall be \$1,560.00, three-fifths of such annual salary to be chargeable to and paid out of the Public Welfare Fund and two-fifths to be chargeable to and paid out of the Old Age Assistance Fund; the annual salary of one (1) Account Clerk shall be \$1,560.00, for one (1) clerk-male the annual salary shall be \$1,144.00 and for one (1) clerk-female the annual salary shall be \$1,040.00 all of which shall be chargeable to and paid out of the Public Welfare Fund; for one (1) Stenographer the annual salary shall be \$1,040.00 to be chargeable to and paid out of the Old Age Assistance Fund the total amount involved for all salaries herein authorized to be paid shall be included in the annual budget estimate of the Department of Public Welfare and the Old Age Assistance Fund, as an Administrative Expense, for Year 1941 and each year thereafter.

The above mentioned salaries shall be paid semi-monthly on payrolls to be certified by the Commissioner of Public Welfare and the Secretary of the Municipal Civil Service Commission, and approved for payment by the Mayor.

This Local Law shall take effect January 1, 1941.

On roll call Aldermen Holland, O'Connell, Delaney, Golden, Behan and Tyrell voted in the affirmative; no one in the negative. CARRIED.
