LOCAL LAW NO. 9 of 1968

A LOCAL LAW CREATING THE POSITION OF ONE OR MORE DOG WARDENS IN THE CITY OF PLATTSBURGH, NEW YORK.

 $\underline{\text{BE IT ENACTED}}$ by the Mayor and Common Council of the City of Plattsburgh, New York.

SECTION 1. There is hereby created in the City of Plattsburgh, New York, the position of Dog Warden of which there may be one or more pursuant to the provisions of Section 119 of the Agriculture and Market Law of the State of New York who shall have all the powers and duties prescribed by the Agriculture and Market Law of the State of New York.

 $\underline{\text{SECTION 2:}}$ The salary of such Dog Warden or Dog Wardens shall be fixed by a resolution of the Common Council.

 $\underline{\text{SECTION 3:}}$ This Act shall take effect after public hearing and approval by the Mayor.
